Weather: TRED FLAG WARNING IN EFFECT NOON TO 8PM TODAY Winds will gust to 40 mph and active fire behavior is expected today.

Yesterday's Activity: Helicopters, heavy equipment, and ground crews attacked a spot fire near the Mt. Lemmon radio towers. Backing fire moved slowly away from Palisade Canyon, Scout Camp, and Willow Canyon. Firing

operations continued south from Green Mountain along the Catalina Highway. Fireline construction, structure protection, and burnout operations continued west of Redington near Piety Hill Road (#649), Lone Hill Tank, and Donovan Ridge. Wind driven fire moved east through the Burro fire scar into upper Bullock Canyon. Contingency line prep continued on Arizona Trail, Piety Hill Road (#649) and Redington Road. Firefighters hiked Sabino Canyon and did not find any significant hotspots. Firelines along the fire's south, west, and north sides were patrolled.

Today's Activities: Protection actions will be focused on values at risk on Mt. Lemmon and the east side of the fire. Resources will work to hold and contain the 3-acre spot fire near the Mt. Lemmon radio towers. Crews will continue to hold and improve handline along the Catalina Highway south of Green Mountain. Along the fire's eastern edge, firefighters will work to hold existing line and continue construction and improvement of contingency line along Redington Road and the Arizona Trail. Suppression repair, equipment backhaul, and patrol work will be conducted on the south, west, and north sides of the fire. Sabino Canyon will be monitored and initial attack resources will be available for any new fire starts in the area.
